Course Description:

What is the path for each person through sanctification to the beatific vision? Using the fiction of C. S. Lewis for signposts on that path, this course will consider the doctrine of sin (*Screwtape Letters*), sanctification as cooperating with grace (*The Lion, the Witch & the Wardrobe, Perelandra*), and the final formation of saints (*The Great Divorce, The Last Battle*). Other authors will be helpful in understanding Christian spirituality as a struggle to cultivate the virtues and overcome the passions: Augustine, Maximus the Confessor, Sayings of the Desert Fathers, Dorothy Sayers, Joseph Pieper, & Chesterton.

Objectives:

- engage in the discipline of theology, learning vocabulary and method of thought
- careful reading of texts, both primary and secondary
- critical thinking shown in reflection paragraphs and exam essays
- lucid writing and creative thought reflected in course paper
- appreciation of Christian ascetical spirituality

Requirements:

- Attendance is expected. After three absences your grade will be affected.
- Please no screens in class (phones, laptops, tablets). I would like you to *think* during the time we're together.
- <u>3 Exams</u> <u>20%</u> each.
 A combination of objective + short answer.
- <u>25% Analysis</u> <u>Paper</u>: 6 pages.

Submit in Microsoft Word so I can make comments in margin. I will divide the class into groups. Due Saturday morning of that week's group <u>by 7:00 a.m.</u> (I grade over the weekend).

The assignment is to connect Lewis's fictional book with the theological reading from a chapter in Clement one particular week.

- The assignment in the *first half* is: "We have read *Screwtape Letters*; find something in Clement's chapter that sheds light on the vices and temptations Lewis described."
- The assignment in the second half is: "We have read Great Divorce; find something in Clement's chapter that sheds light on the purgation and deification Lewis described."

These are not summary reviews, or just opinion pieces. They are to explore how a theological doctrine explained by Clement is made evident in *Screwtape* or *Divorce*. *Either* (a) start with the theology and show how Lewis illustrates it, or (b) start with the fiction and show how the theology explains it.

- 15% Preparation/Participation Based on a *total* of all the following:
 - 10 <u>Reading Checks</u> 2 points each, done in Sakai: 4 randomly selected questions (.5 point each) about the day's reading. It must be completed <u>before class</u> (it will go dead at 2:20 pm).
 - 5 Paragraph reflections 2 points each, done in Sakai: On the days there is a reading assigned from Ward's Sayings of the Desert Fathers I will ask a question that requires a paragraph from you. These I need by 12:00 p.m. the day of class in order to have time to gather something from your answers and present in class (it will go dead at that time).

The purpose of these is to make sure you keep up with the reading and come to class prepared. *Therefore, no make-ups if you miss one.* Altogether they contribute 15% to your grade, so no single missed assignment will ruin you (although if you regularly neglect doing them it will affect the final grade). And I'll throw out the 2 lowest scores.

Grading is: 0 if you don't do it, 1 for the effort but kind of feeble, 2 for good job.
